I have had Paris (as he is affectionately known to us) since he was 10 months old. He is now 8 years old. He is a palomino gelding standing at a big 14.2hh. As far as I can tell, he is the only coloured progeny Kilvington Scoundrel has produced (or maybe you know better). Paris is a multi-award winning palomino winning at local, state and royal level with numerous Supremes and champions in hand and especially under saddle. Boy can this horse move; there is nothing else like him. He is somewhat famous around the show circuit, being so unique; he stands out from the rest.

This year at the Sydney Royal Easter Show (considered the most prestigious in the country) Paris was awarded one of the top awards of the show; The 2010 Sydney Royal Easter Show Best Ridden Coloured Exhibit. This is extremely special to us because Paris was operated on last year where a 3.5 kg enterolith (large calcified ball) was removed from his stomach. No one expected him to make it, so for him to come back like he has is a dream come true.

Just thought you would like to know what a truly beautiful horse your stallion has produced. It is a credit to him, he is obviously a stallion of exceptional quality who passes it down to his foals. The person who actually broke Paris in, Anthony Mountney rode Kilvington Scoundrel in England and has always praised him as a wonderful stallion. Paris is not only beautiful, but a beautiful natured horse we can do anything with. He loves people, loves horses and especially loves his food. There is not a nasty bone in this horses' body. He will always have a home with us.

We are actually considering putting our palomino mare into foal this year with Kilvington Scoundrel. We would love to know whether or not he has actually produced any foals with colour. I have looked up his background and can see he has buckskin in his genes so perhaps this is hopeful, (but really want a palomino).
